Mayor welcomes students to HQ

Forty students from US and Canada have completed two-week Irish heritage course

FORTY students from the United States and Canada were welcomed to the council chamber of Galway City Council last Friday by Mayor of Galway, Councillor Mike Cubbard.

The students are from the Celtic American Irish Academy, an international summer school whose mission is to provide an adventurous, fun and unique insight into Irish heritage.

They had just completed a two-week total immersion programme in culture, leadership, heritage, business sustainability, S.T.E.A.M and service learning. Their ages range from 15 to 17 years.

The purpose of the Summer School programme is to cultivate and strengthen the bonds between the United States, Europe and Galway.

They believe that the positive

progression of the close relationship between the countries will be greatly enhanced by nurturing the youth in this way.

The Mayor Mike Cubbard addressed the students, presented certificates and opened the room for questions.

The students asked various questions about politics, law, other local authorities, and the mayor's journey to be a councillor.

Galway City Council second best in transition to EVs

GALWAY City Council ranks second in the country in terms of the number of its vehicles that have been electrified.

Of the local authority's fleet of 83 vehicles, 24 of them are EVs (Electric Vehicles) – making up 24% of the total.

Only Cork City Council has a marginally better record, with one in four vehicles electrified, leading the country at 25% in the zero emissions transition.

Geotab, a global leader in connected transportation solutions, has revealed that only six out of 31 local authorities in the country have electrified more than 8% of their fleets

It's the company's third annual analysis of local authorities' adoption rates of EVs.

According to the company, over a projected 7-year lifespan of a vehicle, the savings on switching from an internal combustion engine vehicle to an EV could potentially save an average of €12,900 per vehicle.

But while Galway City is a leader in EV transition, it is bottom of the class in its adoption of telematics.

Telematics allows organisations to record data about their vehicles such as fuel consumption, with the potential to reduce their carbon footprint

through more strategic use of their fleet based on the insights gleaned from the technology.

Seven councils recorded that all of their fleet use the technology – but Galway City Council is the only local authority in the country to have none of its vehicles using it.

In stark contrast to the city authority, Galway County Council has just two EVs in its total fleet of 315 vehicles, leaving it lagging behind most of the country on 1%.

However, it had one up on its urban neighbour, with 15 vehicles using telematics.
